## A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

#### Meet Ezekiel

Sunday School is over for the summer. From June through August, Church starts at 9:30, and should be done by 11:00. I'm not worried about the regular Sunday School attenders, because if they show up at their regular time, they'll just be a little early. Those of you who don't go to Sunday School, though—if you show up at the regular time, the evil pastor might point you out at your arrival. You've been warned!

Even though I'm not teaching Sunday school right now, I'm thinking about it. This fall I plan to take the Adult Class on a deep dive into the book of Ezekiel. And I'm asking people in the class to read Ezekiel once or twice over the course of the summer. There's a lot of weird stuff in this book and it will be hard to go deep if you haven't at least been exposed to the surface.

I sometimes describe Ezekiel as the weird prophet. It's not fair, because a lot of the prophets did weird things. Isaiah went barefoot and naked for three years (Is 20:2-3). Jeremiah bought a new sash, then buried it until it was ruined (Jer 13:1-11). Hosea took a wife of harlotry, and gave their kids names like 'Not Mine,' and 'Not Loved' (Hos 1). Although, we go back to Isaiah for the kid-naming prize for his son, Maher-shalal-hash-baz (Is 8:3), which means something like 'quickly to the plunder.' So when it comes to being weird, Ezekiel is in good company. But Ezekiel seems to have more of those things, and his descriptions of things are more graphic.

Consider Cherubim. These are impressive creatures we find around the throne of

God. Isaiah describes Seraphim around the throne in Is 6:2. Revelation describes four living creatures around the throne in Rev 4:6-9. Ezekiel describes four creatures in 1:5-21 and then a second time in 10:8-22. Ezekiel tends to be a little more descriptive than the others.

One of the key features of Ezekiel is the departing of the glory of God from the temple. It is seen at the threshold, and the gate, and then

departing over the mountain to the east (the Mount of Olives). Later in the book, we find the glory of the LORD return to the temple. This is probably the central theme of Ezekiel, that the glory of the LORD will leave Jerusalem, but not forever. The day will come when it will return. This was important to the Jews of the day. Ezekiel wrote from captivity in Babylon. It looked like the Jews were finished and God was defeated; but that was not the case.

This book is also highly relevant to our day. Chapter 37 describes the Valley of Dry bones; the impossible picture of the restoration of Israel to a land once desolate. This is followed in Chapters 38-39 by the battle of God and Magog, where surrounding nations unite to invade Israel, but are destroyed by divine intervention. After this, there is a long and thorough description of the temple and the land being restored, with the glory of God in the temple, where His Prince rules.

I encourage you to get familiar with this book. We're going to have a fun study in the fall.
