Precious Little People

Going to the Greek doesn't always make me laugh—in fact, it's pretty rare that it does. But it did this time.

I was comparing two passages where Jesus speaks of how we treat children, one threatening and the other rewarding. Both refer to children as 'these little ones.' I just wanted to know if the same word for 'child' was used both times.

It was, and I enjoyed the Greek words, "Ton micron touton." Ton and touton work together to give us 'these.' Micron, from which we get micron, means 'little,' or 'little ones.' It sounds like something a Dad might say when he's angry. "Okay, you microns!" The word means small or little, and can refer to amount of something, size of something, to time, and obviously, to neonle.

But Jesus has a large love for these little people; and it's shown in the passages I've already referred to.

In Matthew 10, Jesus has not been talking to or about children. The chapter is all about discipleship. As He comes to the end of this 42 verse-long set of instructions, He chooses to end with an illustration, apparently referring to small children who were nearby, and saying, "Even a small thing done for a small person in My name will never be forgotten."

In this case, the child seems out of context with what Jesus has been saying, but it is still significant Jesus used a child to make His point. Children have a special place in God's heart.

On the other end of the spectrum, we

read in Matthew 18:6 that "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it is better for him that a heavy millstone be hung around his neck, and that he be drowned in the depths of the sea."

That is a desperate picture worthy of a good suspense film. Jesus didn't simply say, this is bad to do; but showed emotion in the way He described the fate of this person. The lesson is not hard to figure out; God

really cares about children!

Is it any surprise then, that His people are quick to get behind a program like Operation Christmas Child (OCC)? It's clearly not just us at TBF; but God's people across America and the developed world jump on board to send gifts to bless children. It doesn't take a ton of convincing; the opportunity is all it takes.

Trinity has been involved with OCC since 2006. That's 17 years. If we averaged 100 boxes a year (a very low estimate), that's 1,700 boxes we've given to 1,700 children, cups of cold water given in Jesus's name. That's 1700 children who learned that Jesus loves them. That's 1700 children given not only the opportunity to believe in Him, but to do follow-up Bible study and discipleship.

When Jesus used the word 'micron' to describe little children, it was a term of endearment to say they are precious to Him. And I'm glad to say they are precious to us. As you give gifts to them, include your prayers that they will receive the greatest gift of all
