"Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter. Many will say to Me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?' And

then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness."" (Matthew 7:21-23)

Man, this is a tough passage! At what point can we be sure that we will enter the kingdom of heaven? Or is the point that we can't be sure? Is it something where we have to wait and see, but until then we can never know? If doing miracles and casting out demons doesn't prove the deal, then what does? On the one hand, we know doing miracles doesn't save someone; but isn't doing a miracle the kind of thing that proves a person is saved?

Seeking something I can hang onto; I see a theme of doing things. First, there are those who 'do the will' of My Father in heaven. They make it. Then there are those who don't make it, and they have an impressive list of what they do: prophesy, exorcisms, and miracles. It sounds impressive, but Jesus sums up their actions with this, 'you who practice (do) lawlessness.'

What is this 'do the will of My Father' thing that is more impressive than these deeds? In John 6:29 Jesus answers that question as plainly as possible. "Jesus answered and said to them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He

has sent."

I think the things I do are much less important than the things I focus on. If I focus on the miracles I do, and the prophecies I make, and the demons I evict, then even though I'm doing these things in Jesus' name, I am actually serving another god, one called 'me,' and I worship this god by the Things I Do. Because this

amounts to idolatry, Jesus is quite right to sum up even these religious and 'good' actions as 'Lawlessness.'

Now the person who does the will of Jesus' Father may do all the same works, and even more; but his focus is never on himself, but only on Jesus and what He has done. This person would never presume to stand before God and say; 'Look at what I have done for You.' Instead, he will look at God and never see his own actions. The words on his tongue will be, "Look at what You have done for me."

Welcome, dear reader, to the Busy Season. We are in the season of doing, and so many of us are busy running in so many directions doing so many things. This is not wrong. Eph 2:10 tells us, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them."

The things you do matter. They are important, and if you are doing the right things, God made you especially to do them! Just don't be distracted by them. What you do matters; but only what He did Matters.
