# A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

### Great Jumpin' Jehoshaphat!

I think I learned the phrase 'Great Jumpin' Jehoshaphat' from Yosemite Sam on a Bugs Bunny cartoon. I had no idea who Jehoshaphat was, only that he was a great jumper. Many moons later, I came across King Jehoshaphat in the Bible. Excited, I started reading more quickly, eager to learn the story of his jumping. I was so disappointed when I didn't find it. In fact, doing a little deep and

serious research, I learned that (in the King James Bible, which surely would be the one Yosemite Sam used) the word 'jumping' is only found once; and it's about chariot horses, nothing to do with any king anywhere. So much for getting theology from Looney Tunes.

Elijah and Elisha get all the press in 1st and 2nd Kings, dealing with the evil King Ahab and his offspring in the northern kingdom of Israel. But at the same time, Good King Jehoshaphat was ruling in the Southern Kingdom of Judah. And he was a good king; along with the typical feet of clay.

Early in his career, he strengthened the country militarily and spiritually. He built up the army and established garrisons; and he gained great wealth. In the third year of his reign, he sent out officials to teach the Law of the LORD in all the land. But his reign was 35 years, and over time he appears to have let things go a bit. At one point he enters a short and ill-fated alliance with Ahab – Jehoshaphat fled and Ahab died in battle.

Some time later – we don't know how much later – Jehoshaphat is warned that a

large army is approaching. Jehoshaphat is alarmed and frightened. My thought is, "Why?" What happened to his garrisons and large army? Why is he afraid of these invaders, and why aren't the invaders afraid to attack? We aren't actually told, but apparently, over time, he let these things lapse. There is a warning to us in this, to not let down our guard. "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't

fall" (1 Cor 10:12)!

But, good news, Jehoshaphat responds to the threat well, and turns to God, who responds with, "Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's" (2 Chron 20:15).

Here is where we find great jumping Jehoshaphat (I think). He leads Israel to the site of battle; but instead of leading with the military, he leads with the worship team. "Jehoshaphat appointed men to sing to the LORD and to praise him for the splendor of his holiness as they went out at the head of the army" (2 Chron 20:21). So I picture Jehoshaphat singing and dancing with the rest of the Israelites as they march along. And it's amazing, because the battle has not yet been won! This is one of the most amazing examples of faith we find in the Bible. They were celebrating the victory before the victory was won. And it worked, because God said.

So, you did great, jumping Jehoshaphat. I hope to have faith to do as well.
