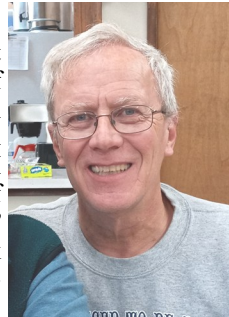


To Be Continued

A million years ago, in the 1970s, my brother told me about these books called, 'The Lord of the Rings.' Three books, each divided into two halves. "Do you have to start at the beginning?" I asked. "It will make more sense if you do, but you don't have to." So naturally I started with book two (or three, I really don't remember). It kind of made sense, but I missed out on a lot. That's what happens when we read the New Testament, but not the Old.

The Old Testament ends with these two verses: *"Behold, I am going to send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and terrible day of the LORD. He will restore the hearts of the fathers to their children and the hearts of the children to their fathers, so that I will not come and smite the land with a curse."* One way to look at this is that it is saying the story isn't over, there's more to come. But Malachi, it is thought, was written somewhere around 450 – 430 B.C. So it's as if it said, "Here's what's coming next," and then next never came. For around 430 to 450 years, anyway. That's a pretty long time.

It makes sense, then, that all four of the Gospels, as part of introducing Jesus, introduce us to John the Baptist as the fulfillment of this prophecy. Matthew says *"And if you are willing to accept it, John himself is Elijah who was to come"* (Matt 17:14). In Mark, Jesus' disciples ask Him why people say Elijah must come first, and Jesus answers, *"But I say to you that Elijah has indeed come, and they did to him whatever they wished"* (Mk 9:13). In Luke, the angel



Gabriel, when telling Zachariah he would have a son, said, *"It is he who will go as a forerunner before Him in the spirit and power of Elijah"* (Lk 1:17). Conversely, in the Gospel of John, John the Baptist denied being Elijah. *"They asked him, 'What then? Are you Elijah?' And he said, 'I am not'"* (Jn 1:21). I don't think this is a contradiction in the Bible, or that John was wrong. He came in the

spirit and power of Elijah, but Elijah himself will come before the great and terrible day of the Lord.

But all four Gospels make clear that John came as a forerunner to Jesus, to prepare a way for Him. All four of them say, "We're picking up the story where we left off." Matthew and Luke both introduce Jesus through the Christmas story. John introduces him as God the Creator from before time, made flesh for us. Mark tells us (In my own rough paraphrase), "Here's the story of Jesus. A long time ago, Isaiah told us God would send a messenger ahead of the Messiah. John showed up, and he's the messenger" (Mark 1:1-4). We're picking up where the story left off.

One of the many lessons we can learn from this is that the Bible is one book. You can't 'like the God of the New Testament, but not like the God of the Old.' Same book, same story, same God. You're just picking up the story in a different place. You can have favorite parts, but even your favorite parts make the most sense when you can see them in light of the whole. I love the New Testament. It does a great job of picking up where the Old left off.

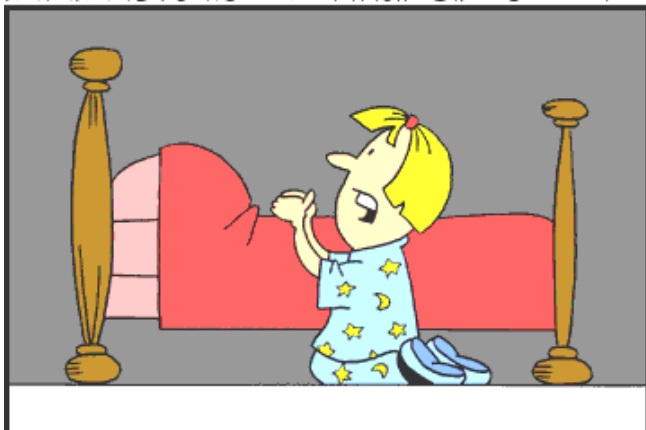
March 2—May 4: The Shepherd Leader at Home. This is an elder-led Bible study for men, working with a book of the same name.
